

Trial Status: December 2020 - April 2021

## **Trial Update**

Since December 2020, following a pause to recruitment due to COVID-19, the trial team have been busy with the main focus of re-establishing communication with sites to resume work on trial activities. We are happy to report that although progress is slow we have made headway in opening the Christie in Manchester in March 2021 and St James's in Leeds in April 2021. We are also very close to opening Clatterbridge and North Tees.


We are aiming to have all sites open to recruitment, as soon as we possibly can, so we can best provide vital research to this patient population to your site. We understand that sites are under immense difficulties balancing COVID related activities, reopening existing trials and working towards setting up new trials. We would just like to express thanks for all of your hard work

During the first quarter of 2021 we are currently undergoing a protocol amendment and an amendment to the patient information sheet informed consent form (PISICF). These changes include; an amendment to the GFR rate where patients who will take Capecitabine require more than or equal to 30ml/min creatinine clearance, a clarification of trial treatment definition, and an update to the statistical section. We also identified that the comparison of exposure from trial procedures to standard background radiation levels in the patient information sheet needed to be changed. Once these documents have been approved, recruited patients will need to be re-consented using the PISICF.

The pandemic has given us the push to move APHRODITE to remote data Capture. This will make for an easier data entry and submission process both for sites and for the central CTRU trial team. The move is currently near finalisation and we will hopefully implement this in Q2 2021.

## Site Setup Status

All sites, with the exception of Royal Devon & Exeter, now have RTQA approval. Currently 5 out of the 11 sites are now open to recruitment and the remaining sites, as seen below, are more than halfway through the set-up process.



Currently Glan Clwyd have randomised a total of 4 patients since opening. Lincoln and Christie have randomised 1 patient each. Royal Preston are actively screening patients but have yet to recruit, St James's are the most recent site to open to recruitment.
