Introduction

On behalf of the Co-Chief Investigators, Professor Simon Gollins and Dr Ane Appelt and the CTRU Team, welcome to the 12th APHRODITE trial newsletter for January 2024 and happy New Year! Thank you once again for all your continued hard work and recruiting into the APHRODITE trial.

Recruitment & Screening

Total recruitment to APHRODITE has reached <u>85</u> patients from across the 10 sites open to recruitment. Our ultimate target is to recruit <u>104</u> patients to APHRODITE from the 12 sites selected.

We have recruited <u>5</u> patients in November and <u>3</u> in December! A big congratulations to St James's who recruited 3 patients in <u>one</u> week! Further congratulations to the Christie who have now recruited 28 patients in total! The table to the right lists the total number of patients recruited per site.

We are now collecting screening logs for Q4 2023, an email was sent about this in early January. Please make sure to use the most recent v2.0 log when completing any screening logs.

Extension

We are very pleased to inform you that we have secured a costed extension to the current grant from YCR, which will allow us to complete recruitment and follow-up all patients as planned. The new recruitment end date is therefore the 31st October 2024, after which there will be a two-year follow-up and the trial will then end on the 30th April 2027.

Site Setup & Randomisation

We continue to support setup at sites opening to the trial. Please note telephone randomisation capability has been removed from APHRODITE. As such, please make sure to randomise patients via the online randomisation portal https://lictr.leeds.ac.uk/webrand/.

Discrete Choice Experiment (DCE)

The APHRODITE Patient Preference project is continuing to recruit participants, and we currently have **63** people who have completed the pre-treatment survey. We have also received six-month follow-up questionnaires from **33** participants already, and we are hoping to get more back soon. We are very pleased to have recently welcomed Royal Shrewsbury to recruiting for the Patient Preference project alongside the trial.
