What will happen to the information I provide?

We follow strict regulations about how we handle personal information. Written feedback, Interview recordings, notes and transcripts will be held on a secure server at the University of Leeds. We will keep personal details (e.g. name, contact details) separate. We will keep all information for at least 5 years after the study has ended.

Recordings will be saved using a study number (not people's names). However, it is still possible that members of the research team may be able to identify you. For example, if you say your name on a recording or someone recognises your voice.

Transcripts and notes will be anonymised before data analysis. By anonymised, we mean that we will take out any information that means people may recognise you. For example, names of people or places.

We may share recordings with an external transcription company so that they can type them up. We have a strict confidentiality agreement in place with that company. They will delete all recordings, once they have completed the work. We won't share the recordings with anyone else, outside of our research team.

If you fill out an online questionnaire, responses will be held on a secure web-based survey platform and will only be accessible by the web-based survey provider and the LICTR research team on a password protected restricted access database. The responses will be securely transferred to the secure server at the University of Leeds and then deleted from the web-based survey provider.

At the end of the study, we will share what we have learnt. For example, via reports, presentations, social media or articles. We may include some direct quotes, taken from interviews. All quotes will be anonymous, so people outside of the research team will not know who has said what. If you would like your name to be associated with what you have said, please let us know. We will never share identifiable information (e.g. names or contact details) outside of our research team, without your permission.

We may use anonymised data for future research or share data with other research teams. If you wish, you can be added to the mailing list to be kept informed about this study and future research studies.

What will happen if I don't want to carry on with the project?

You can stop at any time, without giving us a reason. If you decide to stop, we will ask you what you want us to do with any information we have already collected. If you wish, we can delete all the personal information we have about you (e.g. your name and contact details). Anonymised information will be used in the final study analysis.

What happens when the research stops?

We will use what we learn to improve pressure ulcer prevention support. We will share our learning and the new resources with service users, carers, personal assistants, health and social care professionals and charities. If you wish, you can be added to a mailing list to find out about the results of this project and future research.

What if I am harmed by taking part in the study?

Every care will be taken in the course of this study. However, in the unlikely event that you are harmed, as a result of negligence by the managing organisation (University of Leeds), compensation may be available. You may have to pay your related legal costs. If you wish to complain about any aspect of the study, please contact the study team in the first instance.

Any claims will be subject to UK law and must be brought in the UK.
